

Williams unopposed in bid for second ter Higher Education Center,


Submitted by the candidate T.R. Williams is formally announcing his commitment to a second term as Lawrence County Executive. "I am so thankful for the

Suspect dies in officerinvolved shooting Friday

Authorities report that the suspect in an armed robbery attempt at a Lawrenceburg pharmacy Friday evening, later perished in an officer involved shooting.

Law enforcement officers were reportedly dispatched at around 5:30 p.m. on reports that a man, armed with a large knife, attempted to rob Rite Aid pharmacy, located at 2101 North Locust Avenue.

The suspect, later identified as thirty-three year old Randy Thomas Groom of Lawrenceburg, fled from the premises. He was later cornered by police officers in the vicinity of Murphy USA, located directly in front of Walmart on North Locust.

During the ensuing confrontation, Groom was shot by a police officer. He was transported to Southern Tennessee Regional Health Systems Lawrenceburg where he was pronounced dead.

Authorities indicate that no one else was injured in the incident. As is protocol in an officer involved shooting, the investigation is being handled by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation.
