A local man was instrumental in saving the life of a crash victim in Alabama, helping to pull the victim from his burning vehicle. Colbie Bryant of Fleeman Carriers indicates that he was traveling south of St. Clair, Alabama when he rounded a curve to find a pickup truck had crashed. He said the truck was upside down in a ditch and had caught fire. Bryant said he and another motorist quickly ran to the crash site. They were able to bust out a window and pull the man from his truck. Although they are being hailed as heroes, Bryant says it was just a matter of timing. “We were just right there at the right time,” he said. “He would have been dead by the time EMS or anyone got there.”
